The author has used four pair of pigeons to symbolize the fleeing peace and harmony. The pigeons who are symbol of peace and harmony which seem to be flying away from the Spanish Civil War. It also symbolizes the refugees who flee to a safer place. Apart from pigeon, a cat and two goats are also left behind by the old man. The cat is symbolic of independence, an animal who does not need anyone to survive. To ensure the old man's safety he engages him in a conversation and tells him to take truck to Tortosa as the location, i.e. bridge was not a safe place. He further asks the old man not to worry about the animals. He while talking to the old man, does not forget his initial duty and keeps a check across the bridge to look out for the enemy troops. Therefore, the narrator has a strong sense of duty in both cases.
